
OVERVIEW

Established under Executive Order 534, the Safe and Successful Youth Initiative (SSYI) is a comprehensive violence prevention strategy aimed at reducing youth homicides and serious assaults in Massachusetts. SSYI requires the implementation of a coordinated intervention strategy focused on "proven-risk youth," and specifically young men identified by each city as the highest risk individuals for being perpetrators or victims of shooting or stabbing violence.



Youth Victimization Trends, 2009-2013

Non-SSYI Cities are eight cities not funded by SSYI or Shannon. SSYI Cities also receive Shannon funding. Shannon Cities are the 17 cities funded exclusively by the Shannon initiative.

Trend Analyses

SSYI cities experienced a...

- ✓ 139 fewer violent crime victimizations on average per month compared to 37 fewer among Shannon cities and 11 more in comparison cities
- ✓ 1 less homicide on average per month
- ✓ **65 fewer** aggravated assault victimizations on average per month

Results of SSYI Intervention

- ✓ SSYI had a statistically significant impact in reducing the number of victims of violent crimes reported to the police.
- ✓ SSYI also had a statistically significant impact in reducing the number of victims of homicide and aggravated assault.
- ✓ A city with SSYI has approximately 5.5 fewer victims of violence each month, ages 14-24, or 60 fewer victims of violent crimes per year, per 100,000 citizens.
- As of 2010, the population in the 11 SSYI cities was 1,501,343 which amounts to
 900 fewer victims, ages 14-24 per year or 1,800 fewer victims between 2011-2013.
