We teach youth on-the-job technical skills that can be used in a variety of trade positions while simultaneously teaching soft skills that are applicable in all settings. We do this while creating unique wood crafts and, whenever possible, do so with recycled materials.

Certifications/Continuing Education

All employees of Reclamation Woodcrafts must be working towards completion of their OSHA 30 Certificate, as well as additional task-specific OSHA certifications. Additional continuing education opportunities include personal enrichment classes through Bristol Community College, as well as part- and full-time courses at Bunker Hill Community College.

Employees at Reclamation Woodcrafts learn to

- use a variety of hand tools
- gain an understanding of measurements and design layout
- understand how to safely use, maintain, and operate a large number of power tools
- provide customer service and support
- become responsible for carrying out multi-step projects in a professional manner
- make on-site adjustments as needed to accommodate customer requests or other issues that arise during projects
- clean and maintain tools and work area
- keep a running inventory of tools and supplies needed to complete various projects
